### **HERE TO PLAY**

Welcome to the draw for the Men's EHF EURO 2024 Qualifiers, the next step towards the European Handball Federation's flagship men's national team event.

The Men's EHF EURO 2024 in Germany will be colourful, dynamic, inviting – there is no doubt about it.

The championship's logo and its campaign are the first noticeable signs for this, underlined by the main claim: "HERE TO PLAY!" Welcome to Germany, to play handball and experience much more.

The German Handball Federation unveiled the campaign and the logo which has been developed in cooperation with the Berlin-based agency Styleheads.

"The presentation of the logo and the campaign is an important first step on the way to this major sport event.

This will finally make us visible for the handball family and the entire sports world," says Mark Schober, Chairman of the Board of the German Handball Federation.

"Of course, 2024 is still a long way to go, but we have been working with full dedication already a long time for this tournament which should set standards that stretch beyond handball."

Martin Hausleitner, EHF Secretary General, says: "We can fully identify ourselves with this claim and I believe the same will hold true for all fans and players. It serves as a good explanation for the journey to the Men's EHF EURO 2024 as well as to explain the reason why we are all there. We're really happy that such a fitting logo and claim has been found."

#### A festival for all sports fans

"The basis for the logo design is the place where everything is decided in handball and where emotions arise: the lines of the court. Those were transformed into the compact shape of a ball that conveys the dynamics of the sport," says Thomas Zimmermann, Board Member for Marketing and Communication in the German Handball Federation.

"The six colors of the visual communication are based on the basic colors of all European national flags to show that we are going to celebrate an international, cross-border festival with all European sports fans."

The heart of the communication is the claim "HERE TO PLAY!" This is activated in several variants in order to convey the different facets of the Men's EHF EURO 2024 and the individual locations.

### **DRAW PROCEDURE AND POTS**

32 teams will vie for the remaining 20 places at the Men's EHF EURO 2024 when the qualifiers begin in October — and it almost time to find out who will play who in the quest for the final tournament in Germany. The draw for the qualifiers will be held on 31 March at 18:00 CEST in Vienna and streamed live on the Home of Handball Facebook and YouTube pages, as well as on EHFTV.

20 of the participating teams enter the race after playing the EHF EURO 2022, starting with fourth-ranked France all the way down the ranks. Another eight participants — Estonia, Faroe Islands, Greece, Israel, Italy, Kosovo, Romania and Switzerland — are qualified for this phase after being eliminated in the final qualification stage on the path to the EHF EURO 2022. Belgium, Finland, Latvia and Turkey progressed from the EHF EURO 2024 qualifiers relegation round.

Due to the EHF decision to ban teams from Russia and Belarus, two highest ranked substitute teams, Georgia and Luxembourg (who were defeated in the relegation round) will replace these national sides, rounding out the 32 qualifiers participants.

The pots for the draw have been determined according to the EHF Men's National Team Ranking:

Pot 1: NOR, FRA, CRO, SLO, HUN, POR, ISL, AUT

Pot 2: CZE, POL, NED, MNE, MKD, SRB, SUI, UKR

Pot 3: BIH, LTU, LAT, ISR, SVK, TUR, ROU, GRE

Pot 4: KOS, BEL, EST, FAR, FIN, ITA, GEO, LUX

#### The draw will be conducted in the following order

**Step 1:** Eight teams of pot 4 are drawn to row 4

**Step 2:** Eight teams of pot 3 are drawn to row 3

Step 3: Eight teams of pot 1 are drawn to row 1

**Step 4:** Serbia are drawn to row 2 (not in group with Kosovo)

Step 5: Seven remaining teams of pot 2 are drawn to row 2

### **OVERVIEW OF THE PLAYING DATES**

The 32 teams will be drawn into eight groups of four, from which the top two sides in each will qualify for the final tournament, along with the four best third-ranked teams. The best third-ranked teams will be determined after all matches in the qualifiers are played, taking only the games against the two top-ranked teams into consideration.

A maximum of four of the lowest-ranked teams at the end of this final qualification stage will join the relegation round in the EHF EURO 2026 qualifiers.

The qualifiers will be played in three periods of two matches each for a total of six rounds, during which the teams in each group face each other in home-and-away legs.

With 24 sides set to contest the event on 10–28 January 2024, four are already qualified: host Germany, defending champions Sweden, and EHF EURO 2022 medallists Spain and Denmark. These four sides will play the EHF EURO Cup 2024 following the same schedule as the qualifiers.

The dates for the six rounds are as follows:

- Round 1: 12/13 October 2022
- Round 2: 15/16 October 2022
- Round 3: 8/9 March 2023
- Round 4: 11/12 March 2023
- Round 5: 26/27 April 2023
- Round 6: 30 April 2023 (unified throw-off time for all matches)

From Düsseldorf to Cologne seems only a small distance, but a whole lot of handball will be played between the Men's EHF EURO 2024 opener in the Merkur Spiel-Arena in Düsseldorf on 10 January and the final in the Lanxess Arena in Cologne on 28 January.

The journey through Germany includes stops at the Mercedes-Benz Arena in Berlin, SAP Arena in Mannheim, and SAP Garden in Munich for the preliminary round; Cologne and the Barclaycard Arena in Hamburg for the main round; and back to Cologne for the final weekend.







### **RELEGATION ROUND**

While 26 of the 32 teams to contest the EHF EURO 2024 qualifiers arrived at this last stage on the path to the final tournament based on their participation in the EHF EURO 2022 or the last qualification stage for the event in Hungary and Slovakia, six came from the relegation round.

Four teams progressed from the relegation round as winners of their respective ties, while another two have joined the final stage of qualifiers due to the EHF decision to ban Russian and Belarusian teams.

Latvia, Belgium, Turkey and Finland were the four winners in the relegation round, with Latvia enjoying the most resounding victory — an aggregate result of 72:55 against Bulgaria. Turkey won 64:54 on aggregate against Cyprus, Belgium defeated Luxembourg 59:53 and Finland won 52:45 against Georgia.

After initially being eliminated due to their losses in the relegation round in January, Luxembourg and Georgia were later chosen as the teams to replace Russia and Belarus in the last stage of qualifiers, based on an internal ranking of the four losing sides in the relegation round. Both Luxembourg and Georgia secured a draw in one of the legs against their opponents, while Bulgaria and Cyprus lost both legs of their ties.
