I WELCOME TO THE EHF FINALS WOMEN 2024

WHICH TEAM WILL LIFT THE EHF EUROPEAN LEAGUE TROPHY IN GRAZ?

It is with great pleasure that we welcome all media representatives to Graz and the Raiffeisen Sportpark, home of the EHF Finals Women 2024. After the success of the 2023 edition, the venue in Austria's second-largest city plays host to four thrilling handball games again on 11 and 12 May 2024 for the season-ending tournament of the EHF European League Women 2023/24. The line-up for the EHF Finals Women 2024 features four teams from three different countries, who all had to triumph over some of Europe's strongest opponents to get here.

The first semi-final on Saturday afternoon is a national derby between two Romanian teams. Still unbeaten coming into the EHF Finals, CS Gloria 2018 BN are enjoying an excellent campaign in what is only the young club's second European season. In 2019/20, their journey in the competition's predecessor EHF Cup ended in the quarter-finals, so they have already bettered that achievement.

Their opponents H.C. Dunarea Braila are the only team at the EHF Finals which started the 2023/24 season in the first qualification round, meaning they have played more matches than any of the three other teams present in Graz. They previously reached the quarter-finals of the EHF European League in 2020/21, and the semi-finals of the former Challenge Cup 16 years ago.

In the second match on Saturday evening, Storhamar Handball Elite enter the first semi-final in the club's European history, after they appeared in the quarter-finals of various competitions in the past. They also were in the knockout phase of the EHF Champions League Women as recent as a year ago, underlining the strength the Norwegian side bring to the court.

They are up against Neptunes Nantes, who were the winners of the inaugural EHF Finals Women 2021 when competing under a different name. The only contenders in Graz this year that have competed in all four EHF European League seasons so far, the French side are eager to replicate their run to the title from three years ago.

Those four teams eye the trophy as the stage is set for another captivating weekend of handball in Graz. We wish all media representatives best of luck for their coverage. We pride ourselves with an excellent cooperation with media covering EHF competitions, both on club and national team level. Should you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact us.

SPECIFICALLY DESIGNED AWARD AWAITS THE CHAMPIONS

The EHF Finals Women return to the Raiffeisen Sportpark in Graz, Austria's second-largest city, for the second straight year in 2024. On Saturday 11 May, CS Gloria 2018 BN meet C.S. Dunarea Braila in an all-Romanian semi-final, and Norwegian side Storhamar Handball Elite take on Neptunes Nantes, the French winners of the inaugural 2021 title, for a place in the final on Sunday 12 May.

The champions will receive a trophy which has been specifically designed for the EHF European League. Developed by the Oiko Design Office agency in Barcelona, the trophy displays a goal, as the main objective of the sport, and reflects the dynamic movement of a ball hitting the target. The net formed in the shape of a shield symbolises handball as a team sport.


TICKET CATEGORIES AND PRICES

GENERAL MEDIA INFORMATION

Accreditations

You can pick up your accreditation at the media entrance. The media entrance is located at <u>Hüttenbrennergasse 31, 8010 Graz</u>, on the left side of the Raiffeisen Sportpark from the main entrance.

You can pick up you accreditation in the following time slots:

- Saturday, 11 May 2024: 13:30 22:00 CEST
- Sunday, 12 May 2024: 13:30 22:00 CEST

At the accreditation pick-up, you will be required to present a copy of the confirmation email you receveid from the EHF and a valid photographic ID (e.g. passport or driving license) in order to collect your accreditation.

IMPORTANT: If for whatever reason you are not able to attend the event, you must cancel your accreditation and inform us by email: <u>media@eurohandball.com</u>. Failure to arrive at the event could mean that you do not receive accreditation at future EHF events.

Parking & Public transport

No media parking is available at the Raiffeisen Sportpark (Hüttenbrennergasse 31, 8010 Graz).

The public parking surrounding the Raiffeisen Sportpark is free of charge during the weekend and can be used. Please note that if you arrive on Friday to cover the training sessions, the public parking must be paid (1€ per hour). More information about public parking can be found <u>here</u>. The arena is located in the green parking zone.

The Raiffeisen Sportpark arena is easily reachable by public transport:

- with tram number 5, stop Josefkirche, and from there approx. 400m walk
- with bus 34E, stop Seifenfabrik, and from there approx. 450m walk

Media seating

Media seats will be located in sectors A, B, C, D, I and J of the Raiffeisen Sportpark. Please note that the media cannot book a position in the media tribune. If necessary, the EHF will allocate the seats for every media representative.

There will be a limited number of media seats with tables, however, there will be a block of seats without tables reserved in sector J for media representatives.

Photographers

Photographers can pick up their photo bibs from the info desk in the media centre. A small deposit (20€ or press card) will be required on arrival from photographers to ensure the return of bibs after the event.

Photo positions are located behind the goals. Photographers must wear their accreditation and the bib to be able to access them. Photographers are requested to take their places in the photo positions ahead of the start of each game.

It is mandatory to remain seated during a match and it is forbidden to enter the court of play. Changing sides is only possible at half-time and it is forbidden to cross the court of play to do so: the adequate routing will be presented in the photo briefing.

If needed, a photo positions plan may be implemented. Please note that photographers cannot book or reserve a photo position. Priority will be given to the EHF photographers, major agencies, team photographers and national media of the teams playing.

IMPORTANT: The mandatory photo briefing takes place in the media centre on both Saturday and Sunday at 14:00 CEST.



1 FORMER CHAMPION, 3 COUNTRIES, 4 TEAMS, AND 483 GOALS

FACTS & FIGURES: IMPORTANT NUMBERS BEFORE THE EHF FINALS WOMEN 2024

After the captivating quarter-finals of the EHF European League Women 2023/24 in March, four teams from three different countries have been left in the race for the title. They meet on 11 and 12 May in Graz as the EHF Finals take place in the Austrian city for the second straight year.

Here are the most important facts & figures before the season-ending tournament:

0 participants in the EHF Finals Women 2023 have also made it to the 2024 edition; Thüringer HC came closest, but the German side lost in the quarter-finals to Storhamar Handball Elite.

1 semi-final features two teams from the same country for the first time in the four-year history of the competition: Romanian sides CS Gloria 2018 BN and H.C. Dunarea Braila.

1 of the four EHF Finals participants started their EL 2023/24 campaign all the way back in the first qualification round last September: Braila.

former winner of the EHF European League is part of the EHF Finals this season: Neptunes Nantes, champions in 2021.

1 team is still unbeaten this EL season: Gloria have won seven of their eight matches so far and drew once; Braila won 11 of their 12 matches and Storhamar nine of their 10, but both lost one match; Nantes won seven of their 10 matches.

1 player at the EHF Finals 2024 won the EHF Champions League last season: Braila line player Katarina Jezic, with Vipers Kristiansand.

1 player competing at the EHF Finals 2024 won the EL last season: Nantes goalkeeper Jessica Ryde lifted the trophy with Ikast Handbold.

2 times in a row, the Austrian city of Graz hosts the EHF Finals: in 2023 and again this year.

2 of the 56 matches since the start of the group phase ended in a draw; none in the quarter-finals.

2 teams at the EHF Finals have already met in the group phase this season: Gloria and Nantes played to a 19:19 draw in Romania, before Gloria won the reverse fixture in France 34:29.



2 Nantes players were part of the French national

team that won the world title last December: Tamara Horacek and Léna Grandveau.

3 teams at the EHF Finals won their respective groups earlier this season: Storhamar, Braila, and Gloria; Nantes finished runners-up to Gloria.

3 different teams from Romania have qualified for the EHF Finals through the years: Baia Mare in 2021 and 2022, Gloria and Braila in 2024.

4 goals was the smallest aggregate margin in the quarter-finals, when Gloria beat Hungarian side Motherson Mosonmagyarovari KC 59:55.

6 teams from six countries have won Europe's second-tier club competition since 2016/17: Rostov-Don (Russia), SCM Craiova (Romania), Siófok KC (Hungary), Nantes (France), SG BBM Bietigheim (Germany), and Ikast (Denmark).



goals was the biggest winning magin in a quarter-final match, when Nantes won 39:30 at Sola HK.

10 of the 56 matches played since the start of the group phase, including three in the quarter-finals, featured 60 or more goals.

13 goals was the biggest overall winning margin in the guarter-finals, when Nantes beat Sola 70:57; Storhamar won by 11 goals, beating THC 72:61 on aggregate.



of the 56 matches since the start of the group phase were won by the home team.

50 goals make Storhamar's Anniken Obaidli the competition's top scorer since the start of the group phase; next, from the players competing in Graz, are Braila's Katarina Jezic and Gloria's Cristina Laslo, both on 41 goals.

74 is the highest number of goals in an EL match this season, when Storhamar beat THC 39:35.

260 goals scored this season make Nantes the most productive team at the EHF Finals, ahead of Storhamar (241), Gloria (235), and Braila (234).

483 goals in total were scored in the quarterfinals, an average of 60.4 goals per match.

3,000 fans made Gloria vs Mosonmagyarovar the best-attended match in the guarter-finals.

5,134 goals have been scored this EL season so far, including 717 and 1,291 in the qualification rounds, and 2,643 in the group phase.

I IMPORTANT REGULATIONS

WHAT HAPPENS WHEN A MATCH AT THE EHF FINAL WOMEN 2024 ENDS IN A DRAW

All matches of the EHF Finals Women 2024 shall be played in 2 x 30 minutes.

If a semi-final match or the final ends in a draw, there will perform as goalkeepers. be a five-minute break followed by one extra time of 2 x 5 minutes; there will be a one-minute break at half-time for the changeover of teams. - If the scores are equal after the first round of penalty throws, it shall be continued until a decision is reached

If the third-place match ends in a draw, there shall be no extra time; the match will be decided directly by penalty throws.

If penalty throws are needed to decide the match, the procedure is as follows:

- Only players (incl. goalkeepers) who are listed on the match report and are not suspended or disqualified at the end of the playing time are entitled to participate at the penalty throws.

- At the technical meeting the teams will be informed at which goal the penalty throws will be taken. The team taking the first penalty throw shall be determined by the referees by drawing lots. The team winning the draw may choose whether it wishes to throw first or last.

- Prior to the penalty throws, each team shall name five by handing the referees a list of numbers. These players shall then take one throw each until a decision (a winner) is reached, alternating with their opponents. Each team is free to determine the sequence in which throwers will take their throws. - The goalkeepers may be freely selected from the match report and exchanged in accordance with the rules of the game. Goalkeepers may take throws and throwers may perform as goalkeepers.

- If the scores are equal after the first round of penalty throws, it shall be continued until a decision is reached. In the second round, the other team shall start. Again, five players shall be named who are eligible to play (the players named before may be named once again).

- In the second round, a decision is reached when a goal difference arises after both teams have taken one throw each.

- Serious infractions committed during penalty throws shall be sanctioned by disqualification. If a thrower is disqualified or suffers an injury, an eligible substitute player shall be supplementary named.

- While the throws are being taken, only the player taking the throw, the current goalkeeper and the referees may enter the respective half of the playing court.

- If the number of eligible players falls below five, players may be named to take a second throw in the same round.

- they had the best defence of all 16 teams in the group phase as they conceded 138 goals, at least eight less than any other team
