EHF EUROPEAN LEAGUE WOMEN 2020/21

MEDIA INFORMATION

Welcome to the inaugural season of the EHF European League. The 28th season of European club competitions under the EHF umbrella sees a new era in 2020/21, as the new partnership with Infront and DAZN comes into effect. From the host broadcasters' point of view, there are some major developments compared to this competition's forerunner – the EHF Cup.

The EHF European League enters the arena and it comes with a new competition identity, which will not only have a visual look but also an acoustic dimension with a new logo and new anthem, which were launched before the start of the season. In its appearance, the new competition identity symbolises the energy, toughness and intensity of our sport.

In the women's competition, a group phase of 16 teams follows the qualification stage and the two best teams from each of the four groups will qualify for the quarter-finals. The season will also culminate in the EHF European League Finals tournament.

The EHF European League Men will be played in a new system with only two qualification rounds preceding the group phase. 24 teams in four groups of six will reach the group phase, which will be played in a round-robin league format. The top four teams in each group will qualify for the knock-out rounds and the Last 16 and the following quarter-finals will determine the best four teams of the season, which will secure berths for the EHF European League Finals tournament.

In addition, from the 2020/21 season, fans will have an 'appointment to view' each week, and with no overlap of men's and women's top competitions, TV partners will have better scheduling options. The weekends are set-aside for top women's handball as EHF European League Women fixtures team up with the DELO EHF Champions League matches to pamper fans with the best action involving the best teams in women's club handball. The playing times are set for 16:00 and 18:00 CET (CEST) on Saturdays and 14:00 and 16:00 CET (CEST) on Sundays.

Meanwhile, the EHF European League Men games will be played always on Tuesdays at 18:45 and 20:45 CET (CEST).



BIG-NAME CLUBS TO THROW OFF NEW EUROPEAN LEAGUE

The inaugural season of the European League Women is about to start. The new second-tier continental club competition throws off with four matches in qualification round 2 this weekend, with three of them streamed live on EHFTV.

The playing schedule includes clubs with extensive EHF Champions League experience, like Thüringer HC and four-time champions Hypo Niederösterreich.

Two first-leg games take place in Austria and Norway, and a double-header between H.C. Dunareia Braila and Tertnes Bergen will be contested in Romania.

- **on Saturday, THC visit WAT Atzgersdorf in Austria and Hypo travel to Molde HK Elite in Norway, with both second legs to be played next weekend**
- **another double-header is also scheduled for next weekend, between Paris 92 and IUVENTA Michalovce**
- **the four round 2 winners join 20 other teams in qualification round 3, to be played on 14/15 and 21/22 November**
- **the 12 round 3 winners will qualify for the group phase, which already includes directly seeded teams Herning-Ikast Handbold, Handball Club Lada, CS Minaur Baia Mare, and Siófok KC**

THC face Austrian neighbours

A regular in the EHF Champions League in recent years, THC played in the EHF Cup last season.

Also in 2020/21, the German side will feature in Europe's second-tier competition, starting their adventure against 2019 Austrian champions Atzgersdorf on Saturday.

The match, streamed live on EHFTV from 18:00 CEST, promises to be a special occasion for THC head coach Herbert Müller, who also leads the Austrian national women's team.

Another Austrian team also throws off its European campaign on Saturday, as Hypo play the first leg of their tie against Molde in Norway.

Meanwhile, Molde's domestic rivals Bergen have agreed to play both legs against Braila in Romania this weekend. Both matches on Saturday (throw-off at 14:00 CEST) and Sunday (12:00 CEST) will be streamed live on EHFTV.

Information on other round 2 ties

Initially six ties were drawn for qualification round 2, but two of them can't be carried out following the withdrawal of teams due to the Covid-19 situation.

Therefore, Russia's Kuban and Hungary's Alba Fehérvár are proceeding to round 3.

IMPORTANT REGULATIONS

Scoring of the matches in the qualification rounds

If, after completion of the two matches, both clubs have won the same number of points (no extra time will be played), the teams' standings shall be determined by the following criteria:

- a) goal difference
- b) higher number of plus goals scored in away match
- c) penalty throws

Rules for execution of penalty throws

- Only players (incl. goalkeepers) who are listed on the match report and are not suspended or disqualified at the end of the playing time are entitled to participate at the penalty throws.
- Prior to the penalty throws, each team shall name five players by handing the referees a list of numbers. These players shall then take one throw each until a decision (a winner) is reached, alternating with their opponents. Each team is free to determine the sequence in which throwers will take their throws.
- The goalkeepers may be freely selected from the match report and exchanged in accordance with the Rules of the Game. Goalkeepers may take throws and throwers may perform as goalkeepers.

- The referees shall choose the goal at which throws are taken. The team taking the first penalty throw shall be determined by the referees by drawing lots. The team winning the draw may choose whether it wishes to throw first or last.
- If the scores are equal after the first round of penalty throws, it shall be continued until a decision is reached. In the second round, the other team shall start. Again, five players shall be named who are eligible to play (the players named before may be named once again).
- In the second round, a decision (a winner) is reached when a goal difference arises after both teams have taken one throw each.
- Serious infractions committed during penalty throws shall be sanctioned by disqualification. If a thrower is disqualified or suffers an injury, an eligible substitute player shall be supplementary named.
- While the throws are being taken, only the player taking the throw, the current goalkeeper and the referees may enter the respective half of the playing court.
- If the number of eligible players falls below five, players may be named to take a second throw in the same round.
