

I EHF FINAL4 MEN LINEUP CONFIRMED

The quarter-finals of the EHF Champions League Men concluded last week with three of the four ties going right down to the wire.

- Aalborg and PSG secured first two semi-final spots on Wednesday
- Aalborg booked their debut EHF FINAL4 with a narrow aggregate win vs Flensburg
- PSG overthrew the defending champions THW Kiel to clinch their berth
- Nantes held on in the second leg to beat Veszprém by two on aggregate
- Barça cruised to two victories over HC Meshkov Brest



I SEMI-FINALS PAIRINGS TO BE DETERMINED IN VIENNA

The EHF Champions League 2020/21 started with 16 teams. Only four of them are still in the race for the title: Aalborg Håndbold, Barça, HBC Nantes and Paris Saint-Germain Handball.

These four semi-finalists, who will be competing at the EHF FINAL4 2021 on 12/13 June in Cologne, were confirmed in the decisive quarter-final matches last week.

The EHF FINAL4 2021 draw will determine who will face who in the semi-finals. The draw will take place in the Sportradar studios in Vienna, Austria on Tuesday 25 May at 11:00 CEST.

The draw will be streamed live on EHFTV, the EHF Champions League Facebook page and Home of Handball YouTube channel, with possible geo-blocking restrictions.

No less than 25 TV stations across and outside Europe are broadcasting the draw live. The draw will also be covered with live tweets on the official Twitter channel, @ehfcl.

I DEBUTANTS, PAST WINNERS AND THREE SPANISH COACHES

FACTS AND FIGURES: ALL THE NUMBERS YOU NEED TO KNOW AFTER THE QUARTER-FINALS

After 112 group matches, 14 play-offs and eight quarter-finals, the four participants of the EHF FINAL4 are confirmed: Debutants Aalborg, record winners Barcelona, and two French sides — both past finalists — Nantes and PSG are in the pots for the semi-final draw on Tuesday in Cologne.

Here are the main facts and figures:

- O clubs defended their trophy in Cologne since the implementation of the EHF FINAL4 in 2010. Kiel share this fate after the aggregate defeat against PSG
- quarter-final matches needed to be assessed by the EHF due to COVID-19 reasons

- 1 player has defended the trophy in Cologne so far since 2010 — Ivan Cupic. After winning the 2016 title with Kielce, the Croatian became VELUX EHF Champions League winner in 2017 with Vardar. In 2019, he took his third trophy
- 1 male has won the trophy in Cologne as a player and a coach: Filip Jicha — 2010 and 2012 on the court and 2020 on the bench; all for THW Kiel
- 1 team turned a defeat in the first-leg quarterfinal into the ticket to Cologne: PSG. Aalborg and Nantes lost the second-leg matches, but qualified
- 1 goal was the closest aggregate gap in the quarter-finals, when Aalborg eliminated Flensburg 55:54. In the play-offs against Porto, Aalborg were equal on goals, but proceeded thanks to the away goal rule
- 1 team won both quarter-finals: Barcelona

(against Meshkov Brest)

- 1 previous EHF Champions League winner is still in the race for the trophy: Barcelona (1996–2000, 2005, 2011, 2015). Kiel (2007, 2010, 2012, 2020) and Flensburg (2014) were eliminated in the quarter-finals; Vardar (2017, 2019), Celje (2004) and Kielce (2016) in the play-offs
- 2 head coaches of the four EHF FINAL4 participants have won the EHF Champions League as coaches: Xavi Pascual (Barcelona/two) and Raul Gonzalez (PSG/one). Alberto Entrerrios (Nantes) has won the Champions League three times as a player with Ciudad Real. Stefan Madsen (Aalborg) has never reached this stage of the EHF Champions League
- 2 for the second time, after 2018, more than one French team qualified for the EHF FINAL4. Three years ago it was winners Montpellier, finalists Nantes and third-ranked team PSG. Now, Nantes and Paris are back
- 2 of the four EHF FINAL4 2021 participants were part of the last EHF FINAL4 in December 2020 Barcelona were runners-up and Paris finished third after the sides duelled in the semi-final (37:32 in favour of Barcelona)
- 3 of the four EHF FINAL4 participants have been part of at least one EHF FINAL4 (inaugurated in 2010): Barcelona (now nine participations and two trophies), Paris (now four participations and zero trophies) and Nantes (now two participations and zero trophies). The only exceptions are debutants Aalborg.

Spanish head coaches are still part of the competition — Xavi Pascual (Barcelona), Alberto Entrerrios (Nantes) and Raul Gonzalez (PSG) — and at least one of them will make it to the final.

- 3 males have won the EHF Champions League as players and coaches: Talant Dujshebaev (player for Santander; coach of Ciudad Real and Kielce), Roberto Parrondo (player of Ciudad Real; coach of HC Vardar) and Filip Jicha (player and later coach of THW Kiel). Alberto Entrerrios could become number four
- 5 different nations are represented by the 12 previous winners of the EHF FINAL4: Germany (Kiel in 2010, 2012 and 2020; Hamburg in 2013; Flensburg in 2014), Spain (Barcelona in 2011 and 2015), Poland (Kielce in 2016), North Macedonia (Vardar in 2017 and 2019) and France (Montpellier in 2018). Two of those nations (Spain and France) are still represented in the race for the 2021 trophy

times in nine home matches this season, Barcelona scored 40 or more goals

- 9 for the ninth time since 2010, the defending champions did not qualify for the EHF FINAL4
- 10 group matches and zero play-offs or quarterfinals — ended with 70 and more goals scored
- 12 matches seven of 112 group matches, four of 14 play-offs and one of eight quarter-finals ended with a difference of 10 or more goals
- 14 previous Champions League winners are in the squads of the four participants: seven for Barcelona, four for Paris, three for Nantes and zero for Aalborg
- 15 different clubs had been part of the 11 EHF FINAL 4 events. The 16th club is Aalborg, the Danish debutants in 2021
- 16 points in 18 matches seven victories, two draws and nine defeats were enough for Nantes to qualify for the EHF FINAL4
- 17 times, including the 2020/21 season,
 Barcelona have qualified for the semi-finals in the
 EHF Champions League. Next among the 2021
 semi-finalists are Paris (five), Nantes (two) and
 debutants Aalborg (one)
- 19 goals in a single match was the lowest score of

- a team so far this season: first, when Szeged lost the group match 19:25 at Porto, then Elverum's 19:39 loss in Barcelona in the play-offs. Flensburg scored 21 goals in the away quarter-final in Aalborg
- 20 goals was the biggest difference in one match this season, when Barcelona won the second play-off leg 39:19 against Elverum. The biggest gap in the quarter-finals was 12 goals, when Barcelona beat Brest 40:28.
- 27 group matches in a row have been won by Barcelona since the opening defeat in Szeged in the 2019/20 season. In total, Barcelona won 32 of the last 33 Champions League matches the only defeat was the 2019/20 final against Kiel in Cologne in December 2020.
- 28 points the maximum, earned by Barcelona in 2020/21 represents a new record since the group phase has been played with eight teams per group
- **40** goals in a single quarter-final was the high score, when Barcelona beat Brest 40:28. The overall high score of the season was 45 goals, when Barcelona beat Zagreb 45:27 in the group phase
- 44 goals scored in the match Porto vs Szeged (25:19) was the lowest score since the start of the group phase. The low score in the quarter-finals was the 47 goals in the match Aalborg vs Flensburg (26:21)
- 45 Champions League home matches in a row have seen Barça unbeaten, including 27 straight victories
- 150 the match on 13 June, which will be either the final or the placement match in Cologne, will be PSG's 150th EHF CL match overall
- 483 goals were scored in the eight quarter-final matches decided on court an average of 60.3
- 654 goals scored by Barcelona for them to have by far the most efficient attack so far — an average of 36.3 goals in 18 matches
- 7,420 goals had been scored in those 123 matches, decided on court, including 6,102 in the group phase and 835 in the play-offs

TWO DEBUTANTS, THREE FORMER WINNERS AND FIVE SPANISH COACHES

FACTS AND FIGURES: THE MOST IMPORTANT NUMBERS PRIOR TO THE START OF QUARTER-FINAL MATCHES

After 112 group matches and 14 play-off clashes in the EHF Champions League, Europe's top eight clubs are just 120 minutes away from June's EHF FINAL4 in Cologne. Barça lead the way in many of the rankings but the focus is also on two quarter-final debutants and an armada of Spanish coaches.

Here are the most impressive and important facts and figures prior to the first leg of the quarter-finals on Wednesday and Thursday.

clubs have won and then defended their title in Cologne since the implementation of the EHF FINAL4 in 2010. Kiel have the chance to do so, less than six months after winning the 2020 title.

- **0** goals was the difference in the play-off between Aalborg and Porto, in which the Danish side proceeded due to the away goals rule.
- opairings of the quarter-finals, like in the playoffs, feature two teams from the same country.
- 1 player has won two consecutive EHF FINAL4 events since 2010 Ivan Cupic. After winning the 2016 title with Kielce, the Croat won in 2017 with Vardar and did it again in 2019.
- 1 male has won the trophy at Cologne as a player and a coach: Filip Jicha - 2010 and 2012 on the court, 2020 on the bench, both with THW Kiel.
- 2 teams are quarter-final debutants in the EHF Champions League: Aalborg Handbold and Meshkov Brest.
- 2 quarter-final pairings include two former finalists: Kiel vs PSG and Nantes vs Veszprém Kiel are the only winners among them.
- 3 teams turned a defeat in the first leg of the play-offs around: Nantes, Aalborg and Brest.
- 3 head coaches of the eight quarter-finalists have won the EHF Champions League at least once as head coaches: Xavi Pascual (Barça/2), Raul Gonzalez (PSG/1) and Filip Jicha (Kiel/1).

3 previous EHF Champions League winners with 13 trophies among them are still part of the competition: Barça (1996-2000, 2005, 2011, 2015), Kiel (2007, 2010, 2012, 2020) and Flensburg (2014).

3

coaches were or are at the helm of HC PPD Zagreb so far during the 2020/21 season: Igor Vori was succeeded by Vlado Sola and now Ivica Obrvan.

- 4 occasions in 8 home matches this season have seen Barça scored more than 40 goals.
- 5 Spanish head coaches are still part of the competition and at least two of them will make it to Cologne: Xavi Pascual (Barça) faces Raul Alonso (Brest) and Alberto Entrerrios faces David Davis (Veszprem) in direct duels. The fifth Spaniard is Raul Gonzalez (PSG).
- 5 different nations were represented by the 12 previous winners of the VELUX EHF FINAL4: Germany (2010, 2012, 2020 Kiel, 2013 Hamburg and 2014 Flensburg), Spain (2011, 2015 Barça), Poland (2016 Kielce), North Macedonia (2017 and 2019 Vardar Skopje) and France (2018 Montpellier).
- 6 nations are represented among the eight quarter-finalists: France and Germany are represented by two teams each, Belarus, Denmark, Spain and Hungary have one each.
- 6 of 112 group matches and 0 of 14 play-offs ended in a draw.
- 6 of 8 teams still involved in the competition have been part of at least one EHF FINAL4 (inaugurated in 2010): Barça (eight participations, two trophies), Kiel (seven participations, three trophies), Veszprem (six participations, zero trophies), Paris (four participations, zero trophies), Flensburg (one participation, one trophy), and Nantes (one participation, zero trophies).
- 10 group matches and 0 play-offs ended with 70 goals or more.

TWO DEBUTANTS, THREE FORMER WINNERS AND FIVE SPANISH COACHES

- 11 matches 7 of 112 group matches and 4 of 14 play-offs ended with a difference of ten or more goals.
- 12 matches are yet to be played this season: eight quarter-finals and the four matches at the EHF FINAL4 on 12/13 June in Cologne.
- 16 victories in 14 group matches and two playoffs is Barça's perfect record so far.
- 19 goals in a single match was the lowest score of a team so far: first when Szeged lost the group phase match 25:19 at Porto, then Elverum's 39:19 loss in Barcelona.
- 20 goals was the biggest win of the season when Barça beat Elverum 39:19 in the play-offs second leg.
- 21 times, including the 2020/21 season, Kiel and Barça have each made it at least to the quarter-finals in the EHF Champions League. Veszprém play their 19th quarter-final, Flensburg number 13 ahead of PSG (8) and Nantes (4).
- 27 group matches in a row were won by Barça since the opening defeat to Szeged in the 2019/20 season. In total, Barcelona won 30 of their last 31 Champions League matches their only defeat was against Kiel at the EHF FINAL4 in December 2020.
- 28 points, the optimum earned by Barça, is a new record since the group phase is played with eight teams per group. 26 points by PSG and Barça was the previous record.
- +32 was the impressive goal difference of Barça in the play-offs against Elverum, ahead of +23 goals for Veszprém vs Vardar and +21 goals for PSG vs Celje.
- 41 goals in a single play-off match was the highest score, when Veszprém beat Vardar 41:27, the overall highest score by one team this season was 45 goals when Barcelona beat Zagreb 45:27 in the group phase.

- 48 away victories occurred in the 112 group matches (42) and the 14 play-offs (6).
- 59 times, 60 or more goals were scored in group matches (50) and play-offs (9).
- **61** times in 112 group matches (53) and 14 playoffs (8) the home side was victorious.
- 69 goals was the highest-scoring game of the play-offs, when Veszprém beat Vardar 39:30, 76 goals is the high-score for the season when Barça beat Zaporozhye 42:34.
- 90 goals were scored by Alex Dujshebaev (Kielce) to be the top scorer of the competition so far, ahead of Valero Rivera (Nantes) on 76, the best scorer still in the competition, and Mikita Vailupau of Brest on 75.
- +125 goals is the impressive goal difference of Barcelona after 14 group matches and two playoffs, an average of +7.81 in every match.
- 300 the EHF Champions League final against Barça on 29 December was THW Kiel's 300th match at this level. Veszprém had the same record of 300 Champions League matches in the group phase, just when they beat Kiel 42:31.
- **581** goals scored by Barça is the most prolific attack of the season an average of 36.1 in 16 matches.
- 835 goals were scored in the 14 play-off matches, an average of 59.6 per game.
- 6,937 goals were scored in 115 matches this season, including 6102 in the group phase, an average of 60.3 per game.
