I WELCOME TO THE MASCHINENSUCHER EHF FINALS 2025

WHICH TEAM WILL LIFT THE EHF EUROPEAN LEAGUE TROPHY IN HAMBURG?

The second season of the EHF European League Men under an adapted competition format is reaching its summit — the Maschinensucher EHF Finals 2025 on 24/25 May, like last year at Barclays Arena in Hamburg. A total of 42 teams were on the starting grid when the qualification round threw off last August. Now, just four contenders are left as we head into the last four matches of a tantalising season, which will for sure get a fitting finish at the 13,182-capacity arena in Hamburg as all teams are ready to go all-in and earn greatness.

Germany has been hugely dominant in Europe's second-tier club competition over the past two decades, winning 18 of the 20 trophies since 2004. And like last season, no less than three German teams are present in Hamburg, eager to add yet another European club title for their country.

SG Flensburg-Handewitt lifted the trophy a year ago and they are back at the EHF Finals following a 12-match campaign that left them unbeaten, with 10 wins and two draws — both against FENIX Toulouse in the main round. Flensburg meet MT Melsungen in an all-German semi-final on Saturday 24 May at 15:00 CEST.



Melsungen played more matches (16) than any of the other EHF Finals contenders, since they started in the qualification round and went through the play-offs. In the quarter-finals, Melsungen earned the biggest aggregate win of all teams when they defeated Irudek Bidasoa Irun by 11 goals.

In the second semi-final at 18:00 CEST, THW Kiel are up against Montpellier Handball in an eye-catching match-up between two multiple EHF Champions League winners. Kiel arrive in Hamburg on the back of an impressive campaign without defeat, with 10 wins and two draws from 12 matches.

However, Montpellier went even one win better — 11 from their 12 matches. But contrary to Flensburg and Kiel, the French side also had to swallow a defeat on their road to the EHF Finals, when they went down to GOG in a away match in Denmark in the main round.

Those four teams eye the trophy as the stage is set for another captivating weekend of handball in Hamburg. We wish all media representatives best of luck for their coverage of the season-ending event in the EHF European League Men 2024/25. We pride ourselves with an excellent cooperation with all media covering EHF competitions, both on club and national team level. Should you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact us.

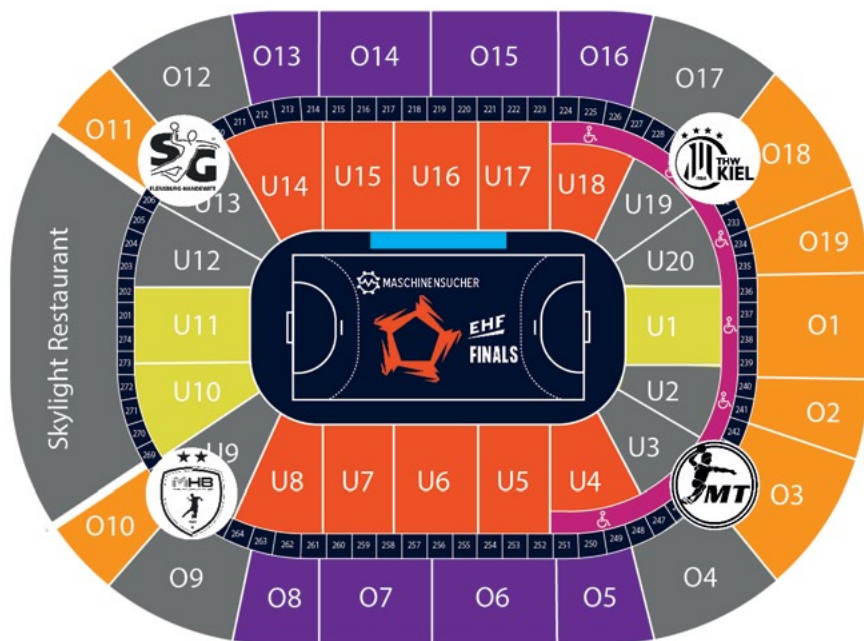

Accreditations

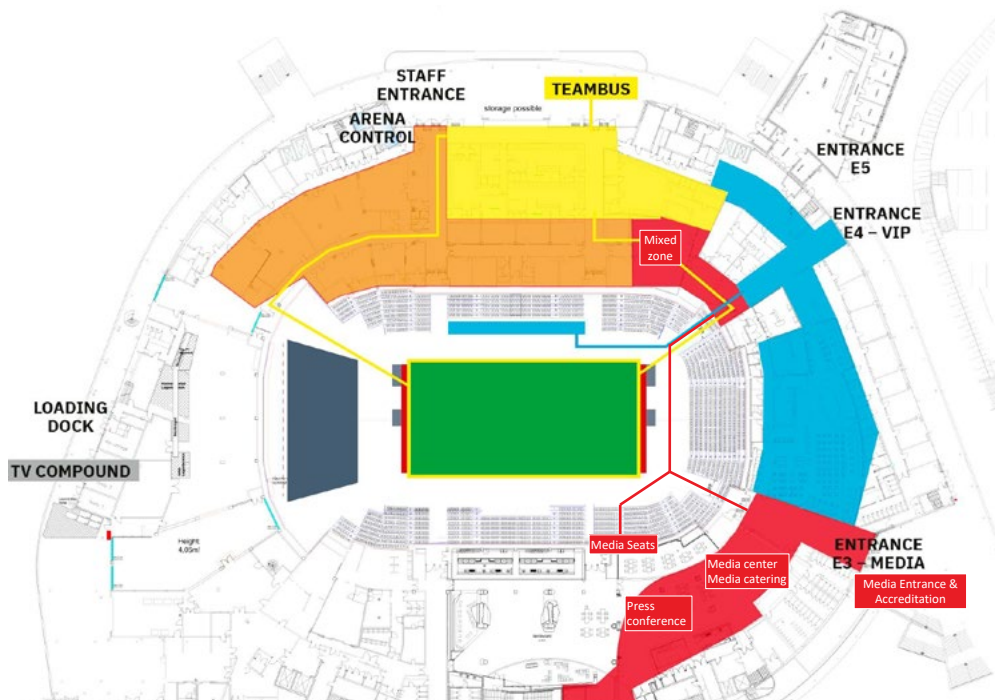
You can pick up your accreditation for the Maschinensucher EHF Finals 2025 at the media entrance of Barclays Arena. Please bring the confirmation e-mail and a photo ID with you. The entrance to the media area is located in the southeast of the Barclays Arena (Entrance E3).

Accreditation pick-up is possible:

- Saturday, 24 May from 10:00 to 18:00 CEST
- Sunday, 25 May from 10:00 to 18:00 CEST

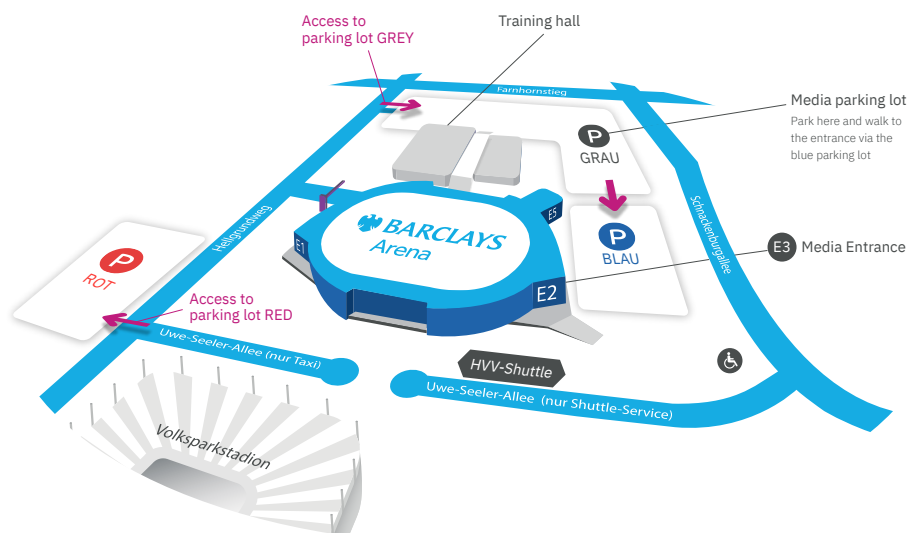
Parking & public transport

If you arrive by car, you can use the arena car park “Parking Arena Grey”. The entrance to the parking lot is staffed from 9:00 CEST onwards on event days. The parking fee for one entire day is €10. A limited number of free-of-charge parking passes for accredited media is available and can be requested from the EHF by sending an email to media@eurohandball.com.

With your accreditation you can use public transport in Hamburg (zones A to F) for free:

- Suburban trains (S-Bahn): Take S3 (direction Pinneberg) or S5 (direction Elbgaustraße) and exit at “Stellingen - Arenen”. From about 12:30 CEST onwards a bus shuttle will run regularly from the train station to Barclays Arena.
- Metrobus: Take line 22 (S-Blankenese - U-Kellinghusenstr.) and exit at “Hellgrundweg/Arenen” or line 180 and (S-Holstenstr. - S-Stellingen - Arenen) exit at “Am Volkspark”.

Media centre

The media centre is located at the “OnStage” inside Barclays Arena. The entrance for media representatives is located in the southeast of the arena (Entrance E3). The media seats are located directly above the media centre. From the media seats there is easy access to the mixed zone by crossing behind the playing field and exiting through the northeast gate. Workspaces will be available in the media centre. The post-match press conferences will also take place in the media centre. A dedicated media catering will be available.

Media tribune

Media seats (with tables, cabled internet, wifi and plugs) will be in sectors U4 and U5 of the lower tier of Barclays arena. A certain number of seats will be allocated prior to the event to written media representatives. There will be media volunteers available to show you to your seats.

Media catering

Coffee, water, non-alcoholic beverages and snacks will be available in the catering area of the media centre. Catering hours:

- Saturday, 24 May from 10:00 to 21:30 CEST
- Sunday, 25 May from 10:00 to 21:30 CEST

Please note that smoking is **strictly forbidden** inside Barclays Arena.

Photographers

Photographers can pick up their photo bibs from the info desk in the media centre. A small deposit (€20 or press card) will be required on arrival to ensure the return of bibs after the event.

Photo positions are located behind the goals. Photographers must wear their accreditation and the bib to be able to access them. Photographers are requested to take their places in the photo positions ahead of the start of each game. It is mandatory to remain seated during a match and it is forbidden to enter the court of play. Changing sides is only possible at half-time and it is forbidden to cross the court of play to do so. The adequate routing will be presented in the photo briefing.

If deemed necessary, a photo positions plan may be implemented. Photographers cannot book or reserve a position. Priority will be given to the EHF photographers, major agencies, team photographers, and national media of the teams playing.

IMPORTANT: The mandatory photo briefing takes place in the media centre on both Saturday and Sunday at 14:00 CEST.

ROAD TO HAMBURG



1 DEFENDING CHAMPION, 2 NATIONS, 4 TEAMS, AND 8,823 GOALS

FACTS & FIGURES: THE NUMBERS AND STATS OF THE MASCHINENSUCHER EHF FINALS 2025

After 144 matches since the start of the group matches, the competition is ready for the season-ending Maschinensucher EHF Finals 2025. In an all-German duel, MT Melsungen take on SG Flensburg-Handewitt in the first semi-final, before THW Kiel face Montpellier Handball for a German-French clash in the second semi-final.

Here are interesting facts and figures ahead of the Maschinensucher EHF Finals 2025:

1 team from last year's EHF Finals is part of the event again: defending champions Flensburg, who are also the only previous winners of the EHF European League trophy still in competition.

1 of the four German teams this season has not reached the final event: VfL Gummersbach lost 55:54 on aggregate to Melsungen in the play-offs.

1

team has made it to the Maschinensucher EHF Finals 2025 all the way from the qualification round: MT Melsungen.

2 of the 5 EHF Finals so far have had the same host city — Hamburg, in 2024 and 2025.

2 nations are represented by the four clubs playing in Hamburg: Germany and France.

2 teams in Hamburg played at the EHF Finals in the past: Montpellier finished fourth in 2023, and Flensburg lifted the trophy in 2024; Melsungen and Kiel are first-time participants.

2 teams competing at the EHF Finals played in the Machineseecker EHF Champions League last season — and they met in the quarter-finals, when Kiel beat Montpellier; those teams will duel again in Hamburg, in the second semi-final.

2 teams are still unbeaten this EHF European League season: Flensburg and Kiel; they both had 10 wins and two draws from their 12 matches.

2 teams at the EHF Finals have won the former EHF Cup (until 2020): Flensburg in 1997, and Kiel in 1998, 2002, 2004, and 2019.

3 German teams have qualified for an EHF Finals event for the third time; SC Magdeburg, Füchse Berlin, and Rhein-Neckar Löwen took part in 2021; Flensburg, Füchse, and Löwen in 2024.

3

teams playing in Hamburg have won the EHF Champions League in the past: Montpellier Handball, SG Flensburg-Handewitt, and THW Kiel.

3 teams won both quarter-final legs: Melsungen against Irudek Bidasoa Irun, Flensburg against GOG, and Montpellier against FC Porto; Kiel had one draw against Limoges Handball.

3 of the four EHF European League titles so far have gone to German clubs: Magdeburg (2021), Füchse (2023), and Flensburg (2024); Portuguese side Sport Lisboa e Benfica won in 2022.

4 goals was the smallest aggregate margin in the quarter-finals, when Montpellier beat Porto 65:61; next was five, at Kiel vs Limoges 61:56.

4 of the eight quarter-final matches were won by the home team; in the play-offs, all eight matches were won by the home team as three of the four ties were decided by a single goal on aggregate.

games since the start of the group matches have been attended by 5,000 or more spectators

10 goals was the biggest margin in a quarter-final match, when Melsungen beat Irun 32:22.

11 different teams have played at the four EHF Finals held so far (since 2021): Fühse (three times), Löwen, Magdeburg, Orlen Wisla Plock (two times each), Benfica, Dinamo Bucuresti, Flensburg, Frisch Auf Göppingen, Fraikin BM, Granollers, Montpellier, and RK Nexø.

of the 144 games since the start of the group matches ended in a draw, including one quarter-final match: Limoges vs Kiel 26:26.

15 of the 144 games since the start of the group matches featured 70 or more goals.
20 of the 24 champions in EHF's second-tier club competition since 2000 (EHF Cup, EHF European League) are teams from Germany.

21 games since the start of the group matches ended with a margin of 10 or more goals, including Melsungen's 32:22 victory at Irun in the second leg of the quarter-finals.

31 of the 144 games since the start of the group matches were attended by 3,000 or more spectators, including five in the quarter-finals.

36.25 goals scored per match is the leading average for Flensburg, followed by 32.41 for Kiel, 31.25 for Montpellier, and 30.31 for Melsungen.

52 is the lowest number of goals in a quarter-final match, when Limoges drew with Kiel 26:26.

67 in the game between Montpellier and Porto (35:32) was the highest number of goals scored in a quarter-final match.

79 goals make Tobias Grøndahl (GOG) and Ihor Turchenko (Limoges) the joined top scorers before the EHF Finals; the leading scorer from the teams still in competition is Ian Barrufet, who has netted 77 times for Melsungen.

84 of the 144 games since the start of the group matches were won by the home team; 45 games were won by the visiting team.

85 goals in the main round match between HC Kriens-Luzern and Granollers (43:42) set an all-time competition record (since 2020/21) for most goals scored in a single match.

471

goals scored in the eight quarter-final matches made for an average of 58.88 goals per match.

6,294 spectators at Kiel vs Limoges was the highest attendance figure in the quarter-finals, ahead of 5,250 fans at Flensburg vs GOG.

7,571 fans at Kiel vs Vojvodina in the group matches has been the biggest attendance so far.

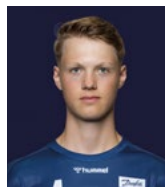
8,823 goals have been scored since the start of the group matches, making for an average of 61.27 goals in the 144 matches played.

I IMPORTANT REGULATIONS

WHAT HAPPENS WHEN A MATCH AT THE MASCHINENSUCHER EHF FINAL 2025 ENDS IN A DRAW

All matches of the Maschinensucher EHF Finals 2025 shall be played in 2 x 30 minutes.

If a semi-final match or the final ends in a draw, there will be a five-minute break followed by one extra time of 2 x 5 minutes; there will be a one-minute break at half-time for the changeover of teams.

If the third-place match ends in a draw, there shall be no extra time; the match will be decided directly by penalty throws.

If penalty throws are needed to decide the match, the procedure is as follows:

- Only players (incl. goalkeepers) who are listed on the match report and are not suspended or disqualified at the end of the playing time are entitled to participate at the penalty throws.

- At the technical meeting the teams will be informed at which goal the penalty throws will be taken. The team taking the first penalty throw shall be determined by the referees by drawing lots. The team winning the draw may choose whether it wishes to throw first or last.

- Prior to the penalty throws, each team shall name five by handing the referees a list of numbers. These players shall then take one throw each until a decision (a winner) is reached, alternating with their opponents. Each team is free to determine the sequence in which throwers will take their throws.

- The goalkeepers may be freely selected from the match report and exchanged in accordance with the rules of the game. Goalkeepers may take throws and throwers may perform as goalkeepers.

- If the scores are equal after the first round of penalty throws, it shall be continued until a decision is reached. In the second round, the other team shall start. Again, five players shall be named who are eligible to play (the players named before may be named once again).

- In the second round, a decision is reached when a goal difference arises after both teams have taken one throw each.

- Serious infractions committed during penalty throws shall be sanctioned by disqualification. If a thrower is disqualified or suffers an injury, an eligible substitute player shall be supplementary named.

- While the throws are being taken, only the player taking the throw, the current goalkeeper and the referees may enter the respective half of the playing court.

- If the number of eligible players falls below five, players may be named to take a second throw in the same round.

- MT Melsungen are the only team at the Maschinensucher EHF Finals 2025 that started in the qualification round
- Melsungen's best previous result in European club competitions was the EHF Cup quarter-finals, in 2015 and 2017
- after THW Kiel in the main round (one draw, one defeat) and VfL Gummersbach in the play-offs (one win, one defeat), Melsungen are set to face their third German opponents this European season
- Melsungen's best scorer is Ian Barrufet with 77 goals; if he scores at least three times in Hamburg, Barrufet could become the competition's top scorer
- 44-year-old goalkeeper coach Carsten Lichtlein, who is on the players list for the EHF Finals, could become the oldest male player to win a European trophy

- Ales Pajovic also led the Austria men's national team until mid-May
- seven Flensburg players won the world title with Denmark in January: Kevin Møller, Emil Jakobsen, Lukas Jørgensen, Simon Pytlick, Mads Mensah, Johan Hansen, and Niclas Kinkeløkke; Pytlick will miss the EHF Finals due to injury
- Flensburg clearly lead Melsungen in the head-to-head comparison in the Bundesliga, with 32 wins from 40 duels

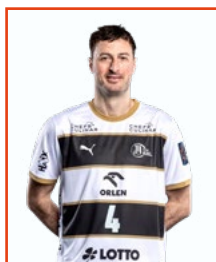

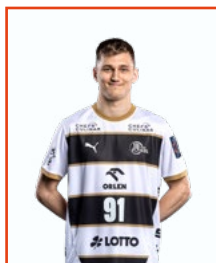
